Plan B - (Ben Drew)



Plan B or **Ben Drew** is an English rapper, singer-songwriter, actor and film director from Forest Gate, London. He attended the Anglo European School from the age of 11 until later moving to a specialist Science College in Leytonstone, Plan B first emerged as a hip hop artist releasing his critically acclaimed debut album *Who Needs Actions When You Got Words* in 2006. His second studio album, *The Defamation of Strickland Banks* (2010), was a soul record and went straight into the UK albums chart at number one. He has also collaborated with other artists such as Chase & Status most notably on the top ten single "End Credits" (2009).

Drew has also had a successful film career as an actor, with roles in *Adulthood* (2008), *Harry Brown* (2009), 4.3.2.1 (2010) and *The Sweeney* (2012). In 2012, Drew released the film *Ill Manors*, which he had written and directed.

David Abraham



David Abraham is the Chief Executive of the United Kingdom's Channel Four Television Corporation, appointed in January 2010. He joined the Anglo European School in Year 10 in 1981, and went on to study Modern History at Oxford.


David's background is in commerce rather than television production. However, prior to his appointment at Channel Four he gained 9 years experience controlling pay-TV channels in both the UK and US. During the 1990s he co-founded the advertising agency St Luke's and helped reposition major consumer businesses such as The Body Shop and BP. In the United States he was vice-president of the Discovery Home network and president and general manager of the TLC channel for Discovery Networks. As head of UKTV from 2007 he oversaw the re-branding of UKTV channels such as Dave, Gold, Yesterday and Blighty.
