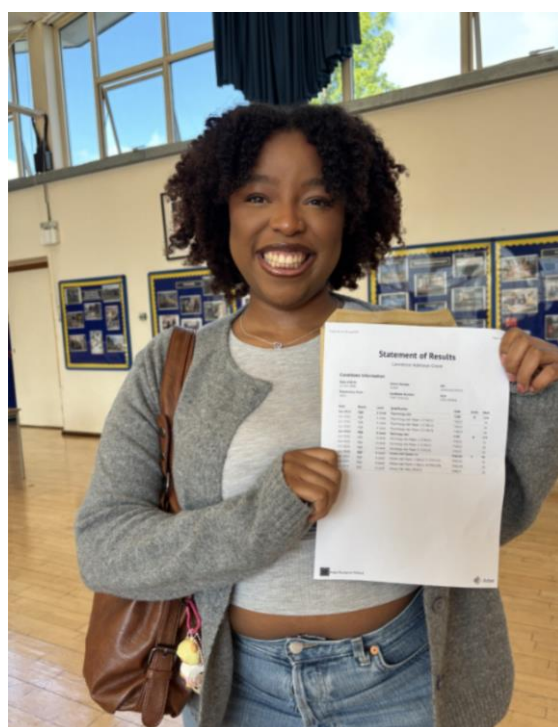
Apprenticeships are becoming a more popular route; Jack is taking up a really exciting apprenticeship opportunity with the Ministry of Defence, having gained a place on the "Government Economic Service" Degree Apprenticeship Scheme with A levels at A C C. Destiny has secured a Degree Apprenticeship in Commercial Real Estate with Colliers in London.

Our IBCP students have also all passed the Career Programme with excellent results. Liam was our top achiever on this route having gained 3 A levels and 2 IB Standards at A C 5 5 C and is looking forward to studying Accounting and Finance at the University of Portsmouth.
