Four students achieved more than 40 points, the equivalent of four A* at A level.

Sophie exceeded the points needed to take up the offer of studying German at Oxford University and commented: "The IBDP is an extremely challenging (but equally rewarding)

programme and I'm really proud of myself for achieving what I did. I gave it my everything and I'm extremely relieved that my hard work paid off. I can now look forward to attending Oxford University, knowing that what I've learnt over the last two years will serve me well."
