

Pastoral care and safeguarding are exemplary and we engender an inclusive culture where pastoral care is strong and effective. Students are well-known to their tutors, Year Leaders, Pastoral Managers, SEND team, Mental Health leads, Medical Support Officer and Welfare and Inclusion teams.

Approaches to Learning

As an IB World School, it is important that we teach students these five essential skills explicitly in an integrated way, in all subjects.

Research



We teach students digital literacy through all subjects. Students develop the ability to research effectively and to adhere to academic honesty guidelines.

Social



We teach students how to work with others effectively. We help students to identify their own strengths and weaknesses and to balance these across a team, and to value the views of others. Students learn how to reflect and consider improvements for future projects.

Thinking



We teach students how to think critically about information and to identify misinformation. We encourage students to consider ideas from different perspectives and to reflect on how they know things in different subjects.

Self-management



We teach students how to manage their work, their time and their emotions. We show students how to be principled and to act with integrity.

Communication



We teach students how to communicate to varied audiences and for different purposes via a range of media.



Global Citizenship

Our Citizenship curriculum is designed to develop informed and knowledgeable young people who are confident about their place in our global society. They will develop cultural, political and financial literacy and are prepared to play an effective role as informed, active, global citizens.

It is planned to ensure that learning focuses on: personal citizenship (incorporating personal, social, health and economic education, the statutory Relationship, Sex and Health Education and work related learning to meet the Gatsby Standards. We study challenging contemporary subject areas related to life in modern Britain including rights and responsibilities, the law and politics.

There are numerous opportunities to actively engage with and apply knowledge gained in Citizenship in activities such as Raise and Give Week, Model United Nations, Jack Petchey Speak Out Challenge, Crime and Safety Awareness Day and work experience.

International Visits Programme

Learning beyond the classroom is at the very heart of the educational experience we provide. The International Visits Programme challenges children to enable them to grow in confidence linguistically and develop informed, open-minds with a global perspective. Staff are committed to supporting over 800 students travel across 8 countries globally through curriculum residentials, exchanges and day visits.

We have a network of partner schools, institutions and collaborations across the globe from France, Germany, Spain, Italy, Switzerland, China, Japan, Singapore, Iceland, Poland and Austria. Year 7 take part in a residential visit to Ebblinghem, a chateau in Northern France, and then, from Year 8, students are able to participate in the international exchange and residential programme. Our Year 9 Mandarin Excellence Programme students take part in an immersive study visit to China. Once in our International Sixth Form, students have the opportunity to undertake international work experience, as well as extensive international study visits.



Language Learning

Languages is a flagship department at Anglo European School, offering an unparalleled range of subjects to aspiring linguists and native speakers.

All Year 7 students (excluding those in the Mandarin Excellence Programme) take two languages to GCSE from the phase one group of French, Spanish and German. In Year 8, they either continue with the two languages studied in Year 7 or change one for a phase two language such as Italian, Japanese or Russian. All students in the Sixth Form have the option to study a language and a range of courses are available. We offer A Levels in French, German, Spanish, Italian and Russian. Additionally, we offer all our Languages as part of the acclaimed International Baccalaureate Diploma at different levels, including ab initio, standard and higher level. We also offer entry level qualifications across a range of languages. We believe that this provides unrivalled opportunity for linguists to combine qualifications in a way which best suits their wider study interests.

Enrichment: In addition to the International Visits and Exchanges Programme, native speakers are supported in developing their home languages in French, German, Italian, Japanese, Mandarin, Portuguese, Polish and Russian. Sixth Form linguists take on the role as Language ambassadors and prefects and work to promote the department and support younger students in developing their confidence and speaking skills. Language Clubs and the Language of the Month programme is an initiative to raise the profile of the 74 languages spoken within our school community. This gives students the opportunity to share and celebrate their home languages, cultures and traditions and to learn about those of their peers.



Mandarin Excellence Programme (MEP)

The MEP is a visionary intensive study programme which aims to create fluent learners of Mandarin, who are passionate about the language, history and culture of China. Students who choose this programme will be immersed in the study of Mandarin, supported by the DfE, British Council and UCL IOE. We are also recognised as a Confucius Classroom and our school offers support to other schools in the Primary and Secondary sector.

Students who follow the Mandarin Excellence Programme will undertake dedicated study of Chinese from Year 7 through to Year 11, culminating in entry for GCSE and HSK Level 3. Students may then choose to progress to IB Standard Chinese, and further HSK Levels 4 and 5 will follow for those who pursue the study of this language in Sixth Form.



Academic Research

As an IB World School, we are committed to developing inquiring, knowledgeable students who are lifelong learners. A key part of this is to teach students how to research effectively and uphold the principles of academic honesty and integrity when doing so.

Therefore, research skills are at the heart of our curriculum and every student has clear opportunities to complete independent study where they can pursue an area of interest and present their research outcomes as a dissertation, piece of artwork, presentation or video. Some students in Year 9 take part in the Scholars Programme run by the Brilliant Club each year. In Year 10, some choose to pursue the HPQ qualification.

Depending on the route chosen by the individual student in our outstanding international Sixth Form, these skills culminate in formal accredited projects:

- A university-style Extended Essay or Extended Project Qualification on a topic of the student's choice
- A Reflective Project about an ethical issue in the real world, related to Business, PE or Computer Science
- A Theory of Knowledge exhibition where students explore ideas such as "Who owns knowledge?"
- Internal Assessments for all IB subjects and some A level subjects
- Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCS)

Every year, we celebrate the research outcomes of these projects in our IB Summer Showcase which includes students from across the school.



Community Outreach and Partnerships

Our Outreach programme allows us to strengthen connections within the community, to support valuable networking opportunities and share best practice. We encourage students to engage in outreach activities which in turn helps them to develop a sense of responsibility and social awareness.
