

International Baccalaureate Results at Anglo European School

Congratulations to all Our International Baccalaureate students who received their results on Sunday. Our Diploma Programme students scored an average of 32, exceeding the global average of 30.6 points.

Our CP students all passed the Career-Related Programme and now await their A level results in August to complete their baccalaureate.

Headteacher, Mrs Gee, said, "This course of study teaches critical and independent thinking skills. These students now have an internationally recognised qualification which has provided a breadth and depth of knowledge and understanding which has encouraged them to make connections between disciplines and allowed them to explore areas which interest and inspire them. The Extended essay and Theory of Knowledge components will have taught them to research and develop a higher order skill set. We are so proud of the open minded, culturally aware global citizens they have all become. Being exposed to multiple perspectives, learning to articulate your own opinions, balancing academic work with community and creative activities, learning through experience, researching and managing your own time and workload has led to exceptional personal development and we know each of them will go on to leave a positive footprint on the world as a result."

We are really proud of all of our students who have passed these academically challenging programmes and know that the rigour of this programme has taught them many amazing skills which has prepared them well for the next stage of their educational journey.

Hei Yan is excited to have exceeded her offer from Imperial College London to study Biological Sciences. She said: "I am so happy with my results and I'm grateful for the teachers that have helped me achieve them. Taking the IBDP has given me a skillset that definitely makes me more prepared for university and I am excited to continue my studies in Biology there."

Eva has secured a place at Cambridge and said "As challenging as it was my time doing the IBDP was made so worth it by the skills that it's taught me and the way that it has prepared me for university study. I would choose to do the IB again, as it's definitely made me who I am."

Our IB Curriculum Manager, Mrs Porsz, commented: "I am very proud of the May 2025 cohort. Not only have they beaten the global average as a group, but there are so many individual success stories and students who have achieved great results in

the face of adversity. I have no doubt that they will all go on to flourish beyond our Sixth Form, be it at University or the World of Work, in the UK or overseas."

Our CP Curriculum Manager, Ms. Pickard said: "Having successfully delivered Year 9 Enterprise Day, and both the Career Convention and World of Work Day for Year 11, our CP students embraced the concept of Service Learning from the very beginning of their journey, and demonstrated their commitment to the international ethos of our school with the creation of culture and language portfolios. In their Reflective Project assessments, the students tackled ethical dilemmas on a plethora of subjects; pay discrepancies and financial corruption in elite sports; the viability of comprehensive healthcare for domestic animals and livestock; but our highest mark was an essay by Rocco which investigated the impact of human rights abuses on international business partnerships. All of their essays made for a fascinating read! We congratulate our CP students with their IB results and wish them every success with their remaining A-level results."
