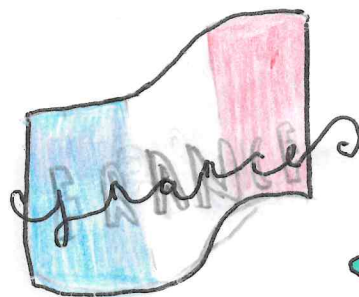
Dear ~~Year~~ Year 7s

Don't let any thing ruin it like having a small room or friends fighting. Just have the best time!



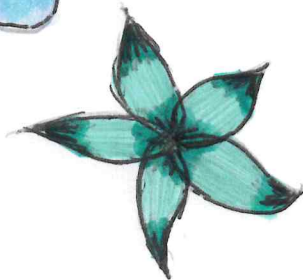
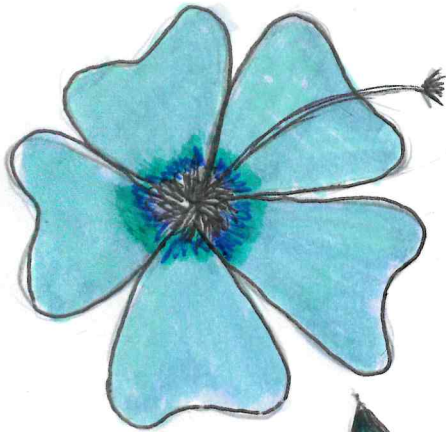
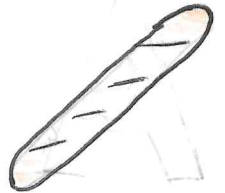
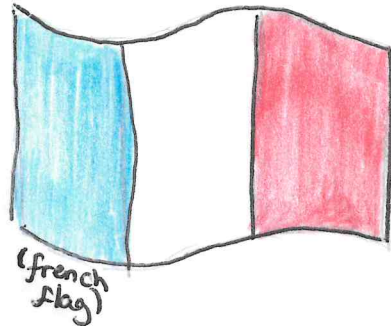

the food isn't really good so bring snacks too.

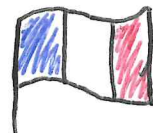

Dear Year 7s

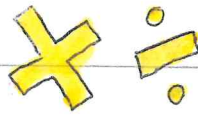

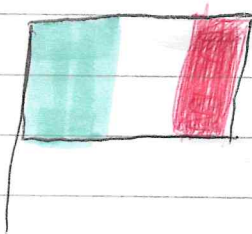
Welcome to Anglo! I know its nerve

- ~~The school~~ After a while you'll settle in. The school could be quite big so you might get lost - don't worry because you'll settle in quickly!

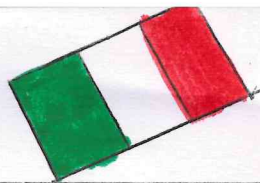
