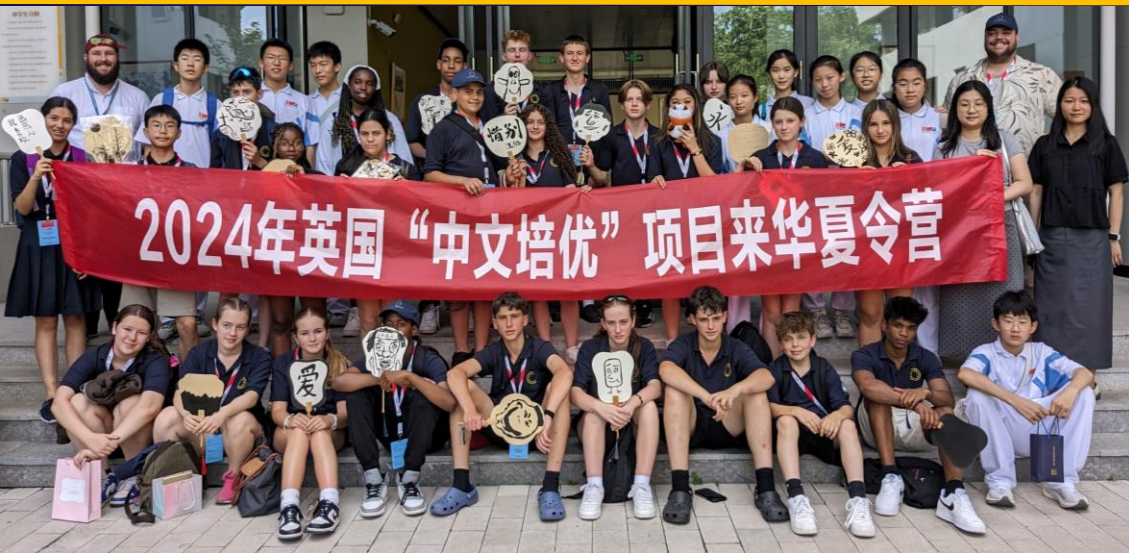

Matriculation



The general matriculation requirement for the Sixth Form is grade 5 or above in English (Language or Literature) and Mathematics, in addition to subject specific requirements. Applicants must evidence an international perspective.

- **IB Diploma Route (IBDP)** – minimum grade 6 in the subject to be studied at Higher Level, grade 5 at IB Standard
- **IB Career Programme Route (IBCP)** – Must study A Level Business, Computer Science or PE, minimum GCSE grade 6 in the subject to be studied at A Level (5 for Business, 7 for Mathematics) and grade 5 for IB standard
- **AIB Route (AIB)** - A levels require a minimum of a GCSE grade 6 in the subject to be studied (5 for Business, 7 for Mathematics), and grade 5 at IB Standard
- **A Level Route (A)** – An average grade 7 from the best 8 GCSE grades is required. A levels require a minimum of a grade 6 in the subject to be studied (5 for Business, 7 for Mathematics) .
- An **introductory language** is optional (Italian or Mandarin)
- Students must **re-sit GCSE Mathematics and English** if grade 4 has not been obtained.
- All students must complete four courses (AL, AIB, IBCP) or six if IBDP

In 2024, 80% of our graduating Upper Sixth students went to University, 31% of which to Russell Group institutions. 9% took exciting travelling opportunities and 11% took apprenticeships or employment roles

- **Closes on 15th December**
- AES Year 11 Parental information evening: **1st October 2024**
- AES Year 11 Students' Destinations Day including subject fair – **2nd October 2024**
- IB vs A Level, what is your future?– **Virtual event, Wednesday 16th October 2024**
- Morning tours can be booked through the website: **22nd October, 5th November, 26th November, 10th December 2024**
- **External Applicants** are invited in for an advisory meeting between **October and January**
- **Year 11 Parents' evening** – **7th November 2024**
- **AES Year 11 Course Counselling** takes place during **January and February 2025** by experienced Counsellors in school to discuss their options based upon reports and GCSE Mocks
